#### A letter from Oddball Foundation President, Jason Wright:



Last year's Michael Cherry 5K was as predicted a beautiful fall day, in fact up until the week before that, it rained, and afterwards it rained again, pretty bad.

But on October 2nd of last year, the sky was blue, and the temperature was perfect. Michael's friends and family, and even strangers got together, and for a brief moment in time, we all came together to celebrate Michael, we listened to his Aunt, and his sister, and others from This is My Brave and Fit For Duty, as well as America Foundation for Suicide Prevention, talking about, that it is ok, to not be ok. For a moment, the conversation was about how to take care of yourself, when you feel like you can't, and more importantly to reach out for help, when needed.

It was a beautiful day, but while I was addressing the crowd, I bravely read a piece of writing far too raw when I wrote it that I didn't think I could read it. And I would have much rather not have done that. I would rather have been with my family celebrating family, instead of talking about suicide.

The year has brought many surprises to my life, and with a new baby on the way due in August of 2022, my life has been rocked by health crises with family members, regarding mental health, and myself, and though I am climbing out of a windstorm of emotions, confusion, and mania, and though all I need to do right now is take a second and heal. I realize, that this walk is bigger than me. This will be a celebration of all that is uncertain in life. This will be a celebration of the rotation of the world, and how scary it can seem to stick with it. So, though not all of us will be ready for October 15th, it will come. And I am going to do my best again, to entertain, and honor, and bring a large community together to honor my nephew Michael Cherry, who five years ago said he no longer wanted to play the cards that he was dealt.

We are going bigger this year. We are going to donate more, and we are going to provide more scholarship funds to students this year. My life might be a topsy turvy whirlwind, but Michael's is over. And I want to honor this sullen fact, that all too often people take their lives for the things that they cannot change, even if they have the wisdom to know the difference. The world is not perfect, by no means will it ever be.

We never know when our hearts will give out. We never know when the tides will turn. We never know what is waiting for us around the corner. But for now, let's celebrate the fact that we have the opportunity to play an incredibly skilled game of life. And remember Michael, because Michael was playing the game of life his way, and he rode his motorcycle his way, and he lived his way, and unfortunately, the days got too dark for Michael. So, we remember him, and my hope is that this October day will be beautiful again, to show people who are also going through the darkness, that there is beauty in community, in family, in honoring loved ones, and in living your life.

## Michael Cherry Memorial Walk Overview:

Michael Cherry was born as a gift on Christmas and spent his formative years growing up in Grafton, Massachusetts. A proud graduate of Grafton High School, Michael loved being a part of his community, be it spending time with his numerous friends and family or working on his motorcycles, even if it terrified his mom. Michael spent most of his adult years giving back to communities in need, through in his travel to Haiti in 2011 or supporting humanitarian efforts in Peru. He was described by all that knew him as a kind soul in an angry world.

On October 5th, 2017, Michael tragically lost his life following a battle with depression and anxiety. On average, 132 people a day will lose their lives to suicide in the United States. Many feel as though there are no options for help or support. Here at Oddball Foundation, we are committed to changing that.

Oddball Foundation is proud to announce our second annual Michael Cherry Memorial Walk. Last year's 5K was an incredible event with guest speakers from the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, This is My Brave, and Fit for Duty.
